Question

The author of "Pizza Party U.S.A." argues that we should have a national pizza party every four years to celebrate the extra day that Leap Year brings on February 29.
Your teacher has asked you to come up with your own plan for what we should do on this day.
Write an introductory paragraph for an essay you would compose on this subject. Your introduction should engage the reader, give an overview of the main ideas you plan to include in the essay, and contain a thesis statement that clearly states what you feel people should do every four years on February 29.

Question 2 (3 points max)

A successful response will consist of an introductory paragraph that proposes an alternate plan for celebrating Leap Day to the one mentioned in "Pizza Party U.S.A." The paragraph should provide an interesting hook, give an overview of the main ideas in the essay, and include a successful thesis statement. Responses may resemble, but are not limited to, the following:

- If you had an extra day, a completely free 24 hours, what would you do with it? Would
 you waste it in front of the television, spend it doing the same work you do every other
 day, or would you try to make a difference? Every four years we have this opportunity—
 Leap Year gives us an extra day on February 29, a day that too many people waste.
 Instead of losing this opportunity, we should devote it to helping other people.
 February 29 should be a national community service holiday, where we "leap" in to help
 others in need.
- Leap Day—it sounds so active—the name alone implies physical activity. You can't leap
 without getting out of your chair. Every four years we get this day, Leap Day, a day that
 too many people spend doing the same things they always do. For most, this means
 sitting in chairs and watching television or searching the Internet. Instead of pursuing
 these activities, we should seize the opportunity and make Leap Day a national exercise
 day. If everyone in the country spent the day exercising in fun ways, we could improve
 our nation's physical fitness.

Rubric:

- O A response at this level is hostile, blank, or otherwise unscorable.
- 1 A response at this level suggests an alternate way to celebrate Leap Day but does not construct a successful paragraph. The paragraph may be missing a hook, may not provide an overview of the main ideas in the essay, or may lack a clear thesis. This response may resemble an opinion on the issue more than an introductory paragraph for an essay. Significant errors in grammar or style are present in the response.
- 2 A response at this level offers an introductory paragraph that is appropriate in content and form but lacks elements that make it successful. The hook may be inadequate, the overall main ideas in the essay may not be effectively explained, or the thesis may be ineffective. This response is clearly structured as a paragraph, but it may not adequately introduce an essay. Some errors in grammar or style are present in the response.
- 3 A response at this level offers a successful introductory paragraph for an essay. The response includes a strong hook, a clear overview of the main ideas in the essay, and an effective thesis. The response could successfully introduce an essay on this subject. Few, if any, errors in grammar or style are present in the response.
